

**Title:** We like Missionaries Need to Learn How to Reach Lost Sinners like Jesus

**Sermon Overview:** Reaching the Lost Like Jesus

As Christians, we are called not just to know Jesus, but to live like Him to carry His heart into the world and reach those who are lost, hurting, and far from God. In a powerful and timely message, Pastor Dr. John Geeter reminded us that ministry is not confined to the walls of the church. Instead, it begins where people are in their homes, their struggles, and even in their sin. His sermon called us to examine the example of Jesus and to follow it with humility, boldness, and compassion. Pastor Dr. Geeter highlighted three core moments from the Gospel of Mark that challenge and encourage us in our walk with Christ.

**3 Key Points:**

- 1. Jesus Perceived Their Hearts:** The first controversy Pastor Dr. John Geeter addressed was when Jesus healed a paralyzed man and declared his sins forgiven. Although the Pharisees didn't say anything out loud, Jesus perceived their thoughts and questioned their hearts. This demonstrated that Jesus not only hears our words but also knows our internal motives and attitudes. Pastor Dr. Geeter emphasized that, as Christians, we must be careful not to fall into the trap of self-righteousness. Instead of resisting when God moves in unfamiliar or challenging ways, we are called to examine our own hearts and trust in His authority and power.
- 2. Jesus Reclined with Sinners at Levi's House**  
Pastor Geeter also highlighted the powerful moment when Jesus sat down to eat with Levi, a tax collector, and a group of so-called "sinners." Though religious leaders looked down on this group, Jesus reclined with them in love and grace. This scene was not about endorsing sin it was about reaching people with truth through relationship. Pastor Dr. Geeter reminded us that, as Christians, we too must be willing to go where the broken and lost are. We should never compromise our holiness, but we must also never withhold compassion. Like Jesus, we are called to connect with others intentionally and lovingly so they can encounter God's transforming power.
- 3. Jesus Is the True Fireman**  
One of the most vivid illustrations in Pastor Dr. Geeter's sermon was his description of Jesus as the true fireman someone who willingly runs into danger to rescue those in harm's way. Just as a firefighter is equipped to handle the flames, Jesus entered a sinful world equipped with divine love and authority to pull us from spiritual death and bring us into eternal life. Pastor Dr. Geeter challenged us, as Christians, to do the same: to go into spiritually dark and messy places, not to judge, but to rescue armed with the Word of God, clothed in spiritual armor and led by love.

**Conclusion:**

Pastor Dr. John Geeter's message was a convicting and urgent call to action. We are not saved to sit still, we are saved to serve. We are not meant to be passive spectators, but active missionaries in a lost, confused, and hurting world. Just like Jesus, we as Christians must be willing to perceive brokenness, be present with people, and pursue the lost with relentless compassion. Salvation isn't reserved for the already righteous it's desperately needed by the sinner, the struggling, and the forgotten. Pastor Dr. Geeter called us to rise up and be firemen for the Kingdom, unafraid to go wherever God sends us to rescue souls and bring Him glory.
